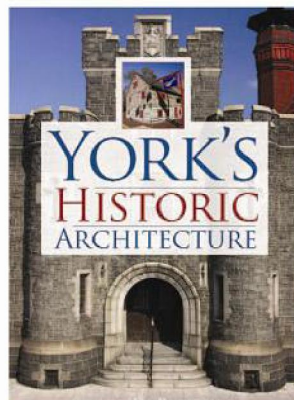
Literacy Council Needs Tutors
