#### Center is "green"

The York County Administrative Center is the first certified "green" building in York City.

The building earned a Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) certification from the U. S. Green Building Council, York-based NuTec Design Associates announced Thursday. The company served as architect and engineer on the building's renovation from courthouse to the county's new administrative offices. The work was completed in 2006.

The Administrative Center is the first LEED certified building in the City of York, first LEED certified office building in York County and the first LEED certified historic building in York County, NuTec said.

The renovations incorporated a lot of "green" features, such as the installation of double-paned windows and sensors that allow lights to turn off in unoccupied rooms, said Scott Butcher, NuTec's Director of Business Development
